UNM FM Engineering, working with UNM IT, spearheaded a crucial project to bolster resilience and ensure uninterrupted IT services for critical healthcare functions.

The project focused on installing an emergency generator in the Business Center's PBX IT Room, which serves as the backbone for providing essential IT services to various medical buildings around campus.

This initiative was born out of the need to mitigate the impact of unforeseen power disruptions on critical healthcare operations. During the power outage incident, the affected buildings experienced a loss of connectivity, causing disruptions in communication and workflow. Recognizing the imperative nature of continuous IT services

in healthcare settings, UNM's IT and Facilities Management Engineering took proactive steps to address

The addition of the emergency generator to the PBX IT Room not only fortifies the resilience of UNM's IT infrastructure but also ensures seamless operations during adverse situations. 
