died this year. The FM Arborist team carefully cut the tree into pieces and efficiently cleared the area. The stump has been ground down below the surface, giving the surrounding turf the opportunity to fill in the area. Although some surface roots from the cottonwood tree remain, these will gradually decompose into the surrounding soil providing nutrients to the landscape. Alan and his team will keep an eye on the roots as they decompose. On Arbor Day, April 26, the team will plant a bur oak as its replacement. The bur oak will provide shade to the area as well as adding to the beauty of campus. See photos of the tree removal below.







normal conditions to uphold full battery charge. In the event of a utility power failure, they seamlessly convert stored DC power from batteries into AC power to sustain essential backup systems. To maintain the reliability of these systems within UNM facilities, comprehensive documented Preventative Maintenance is imperative on a monthly and annual basis. These inverter systems are designed with multiple DC batteries tailored to the inverter size and electrical load specifications. Typically, these batteries have a service life of five years, after which replacement is recommended. Recent replacements of Life Safety Lighting inverter system batteries in DeVargas Hall (30 batteries), Cornell Parking Structure (24 batteries), and Johnson Gym (8 batteries) were necessitated by factors such as age, heat damage, bulging, or reduced capacity.
